*The President enters and says the **Lord's Prayer**.
Then all say the **Prayer of Preparation**.*

All: Almighty God, unto whom all hearts be open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

*The President says the **Summary of the Law**, to which all respond:*

All: Lord, have mercy upon us, and write all these thy laws in our hearts, we beseech thee.

The President introduces the Gospel. All respond:

All: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At the end of the reading:

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise be to thee, O Christ.

The Creed

All: I believe in one God the Father almighty, of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible: And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried, and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the

dead: whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord and giver of life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spake by the prophets. And I believe one catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us; the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honour and glory of thy name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Absolution

The President says the Absolution, to which all respond:

All: Amen.

The Comfortable Words

Preface

The Lord be with you

All: and with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

All: It is meet and right so to do.

The President continues until:

...we laud and magnify thy glorious name,
evermore praising thee, and *saying*:

**All: Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts,
heaven and earth are full of thy glory.
Glory be to thee, O Lord most high.
Blessed is he that cometh in the name of
the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

Prayer of Humble Access

**All: We do not presume to come to this
thy table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our
own righteousness, but in thy manifold
and great mercies. We are not worthy so
much as to gather up the crumbs under
thy table. But thou art the same Lord,
whose property is always to have mercy:
grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to
eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ,
and to drink his blood, that our sinful
bodies may be made clean by his body,
and our souls washed through his most
precious blood, and that we may
evermore dwell in him, and he in us.
Amen.**

The Prayer of Consecration

*The President says the Prayer of Consecration, to
which all respond:*

All: Amen.

**All: O Lamb of God that takest away the
sins of the world, have mercy upon us.
O Lamb of God that takest away the sins

of the world, grant us thy peace.**

Giving of Communion

The President and people receive communion.

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and
taught us, we are bold to say:

**All: Our Father, which art in heaven,

come; thy will be done, in earth as it is in
heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses, as we
forgive them that trespass against us. And
lead us not into temptation; but deliver us
from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the
power and the glory, for ever and ever.
Amen.**

*The President says the Prayer of Oblation, to which
all respond:*

All: Amen.

Gloria in Excelsis

**All: Glory be to God on high, and in earth
peace, good will towards men. We praise
thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we
glorify thee, we give thanks to thee for
thy great glory, O Lord God, heavenly
King, God the Father almighty.
O Lord, the only-begotten Son Jesu
Christ; O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of
the Father, that takest away the sins of
the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that
takest away the sins of the world, have
mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the
sins of the world, receive our prayer.
Thou that sittest at the right hand of God
the Father, have mercy upon us. For thou
only art holy; thou only art the Lord; thou
only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art
most high in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.**
